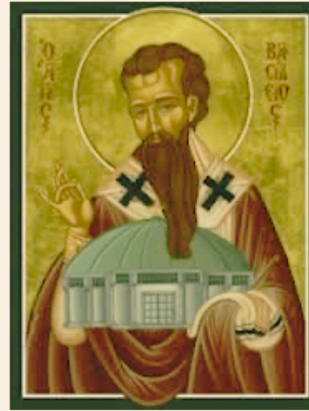

And for those of us who have received the grace of Christ, the joy of Christmas must spring from the fact that we are and live as *children of God by grace!* May the Feast of Our Lord's Nativity fill our hearts with heavenly peace and everlasting joy! Merry Christmas!

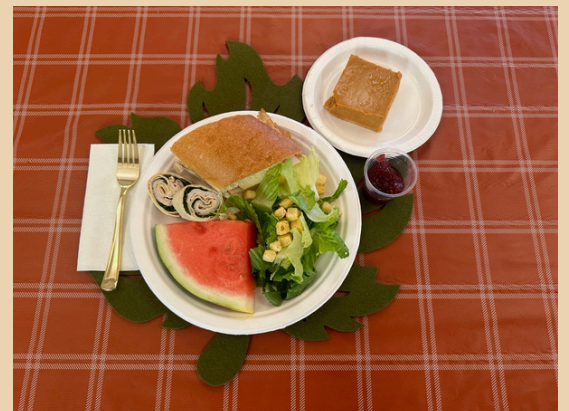

St. Basil's Bookstore

In the Orthodox Tradition it is customary for infants and adults to receive a cross at their baptism or chrismation. It is to be worn around the neck, not as an adornment for cosmetic purposes, but presupposes a witness and acknowledgement of Jesus Christ. Before the crucifixion the cross signified suffering, defeat, and death. With Christ's death on the Cross, it has become the symbol of triumph, salvation, and eternal life. The Cross is the first and greatest Christian sacred object. When the priest sanctifies the baptismal water, he immerses the Cross in it, and it becomes holy. The fathers of the church tell us that the devil fears the cross and flee from it. For this reason, the cross is to be worn for protection all the time.

Orthodox crosses come in assorted sizes and designs. The cross reflects a deeply personal relationship with Christ and a personal act of devotion. Wearing a cross serves as a reminder of their faith and commitment according to the teachings of Christ. The cross guards against physical and spiritual harm. Wearing a cross is an essential aspect of an Orthodox Christian identify.

The bookstore has a variety of crosses available in stock for direct purchase. While you are preparing for a baptism or Chrismation, please consider purchasing a cross from St. Basil parish bookstore. The bookstore also has icons and other religious items for personal devotion and gifting for baptisms, weddings, name days and birthdays. You may view crosses during after liturgy fellowship.

The higher bar symbolizes INBI (Jesus Christ, King of Jews); the middle bar Jesus' outstretched arms; and the lower bar the footstool; the slope represents His Ascension. This cross comes in silver and gold, in a High-Polish surgical-grade stainless steel with 18k gold plated.



Pictured left: Slavonic Cross laser-etched stainless steel, gold and silver plated. The uc is King of Glory. Available in gold or silver. The ICXC are Greek letters for Jesus Christ, King of Jews. Dimensions: 1" x 1.4" inches.



Pictured left: Authentic olive wood Orthodox cross necklace from Bethlehem. The wood comes from a tree that has been growing in Bethlehem, the birthplace of our Lord. Blessed on the Anointing Stone in the Holy Sepulcher Church in Jerusalem.
