A Message from 2024 PC President

As I write my last message to you as president, it is one week until Christmas Day and one day after my last meeting with the Parish Council.

Serving on the Parish Council for the past six years, two as vice-president and the last three as Parish president, has been one of the most rewarding and gratifying experiences of my life. Thank you all for the support you have given me. The things we were able to accomplish would not have been possible without your faith and trust in me. Some of the things are: During my first year as president, I was able to turn our non-income-producing field into an asset by leasing it to Lincoln Unified School District for \$30,000 per year. Over the course of the contract, it will provide St Basil with approximately a half million dollars in new income; After twenty-five years, the St Basil Bylaws were revised, making them compatible with our needs of today. The last time they were revised, there was no iPhone, Google, texting or email; And for the first time, the Preschool has bylaws.

Due to the generosity of the Ray Rishwain, Dean Trachiotis and Bob Henning families, we were able to sell the piece of property on Bianchi Road they donated to St basil to help finance the construction of the Pavilion. Bill and Susan Filios provided substantial additional funding for the project. To fill in the funding gap, I applied to San Joaquin County and received a grant in the amount of \$125,000. With the permission of the Parish Council, I will be making a similar request of San Joaquin County in 2025 for construction of a potential Pavilion #2.

BUILDING THE FUTURE

The Dome - I am happy to say that all of the bids and proposals for renovating the dome have been received as of December 12th. Recommendations will be made to the Parish Council soon. Two of the proposals contemplate a metal finish and two contemplate composite tiles. This is a very important decision, and due diligence was exceedingly important which is the reason it has taken longer than we anticipated. And God willing, we will be able to begin re-roofing the dome very soon.

The Storage Building - I am happy to report that the much-needed storage building will begin construction soon! The building permit was issued last week, and a construction schedule is being prepared by Coy Elvis, our General Contractor. The structural engineer on this project has advised us that the 1500 sq ft storage facility will support solar panels, which brings me to the Solar Energy System. We spend close to, if not more than, \$50,000 per year on electricity. A solar energy system can reduce this cost substantially. I will be pursuing this on behalf of the Parish Council and hopefully it will make sense to proceed. This is a very high priority.

Before I sign off, I want to thank the Parish Council that I am leaving. This has been the most talented group I have ever worked with - Dennis Goehring, Cynthia Pascarella, CJ Frank, Michael McKiever, Michael Fields, Chris Papas, George Kaplanis, Jim Natsis, Carla Wolfe, Anthony Vasquez and last but not least, Tom Chiarchianis. And to the next Parish Council, may God Bless you with faith, courage, strength and wisdom to help you guide St Basil into the future.

Message from Father Pete - PC Elections

Dear Faithful and Friends of St. Basil's,

I hope you and your loved ones are well as we prepare to celebrate the Nativity of our Lord!

As many of you know, we had our Parish Council Elections on Sunday, Dec. 8 and quite a number of people voted. However, it came to my attention that 4 individuals who voted were ineligible to do so according to the Archdiocese Uniform Parish Regulations (Article 25, Section 4). Specifically, the Regulation in question refers to stewardship not being given last year (2023) nor this year as of the election, which makes one ineligible. This error was an oversight and inadvertent by all parties involved.

Since the Elections were so close and since the four votes in question could have produced different results, we have been directed by the Metropolis to schedule a new election. After conferring with our Parish Council, and with the approval of the Board of Electors, the new Election will be held on Sunday, Jan. 5.

We thank our 2025 PC candidates for their patience as we await the final results for the 2025 Elections.

St. Basil's Spiritual Pilgrimage

to San Francisco ~ By Emily Tzilianos Clifford

On December 7, 2024, some of our parishioners carpooled to participate in St. Basil's spiritual pilgrimage to San Francisco. The first of two planned events for that day was the veneration of the relics* of St. John Maximovitch at the Holy Virgin Cathedral - Joy of All Who Sorrow.* The cathedral is part of the Eastern American Diocese of the Russian Orthodox Church Outside of Russia.* Father Panagiotis, Father Gabriel, and Presvytera Iulia met us at the cathedral and introduced us to some of its history and the holy life of Saint John Maximovitch, who has been described as "A Man of God" who could "see into the human heart and draw it to Christ." We met other pilgrims and diverse visitors who simply wanted to peek inside. Nicholai, a Ukrainian refugee who spoke Romanian was also there. Father Gabriel and Presvytera Iulia enjoyed speaking with him in their own language and to our delight, Nicholai agreed to take our group photo!

There is something so special about the Holy Virgin Cathedral -- I felt the presence of St. John Maximovitch and of so many other saints of centuries past whose revered relics and icons surround him. I felt the joy of a child discovering something indescribably wonderful when I identified saints whose relics were labeled in English -- I was pleasantly astonished to discover the Apostle Titus and Saint Panteleimon, to name just a few. The cathedral is a very prayerful place that offers the joy and peace of Christ with His beloved martyrs and saints. Father Gabriel taught us how to compose a prayer to Saint John Maximovitch with the names of our living and departed loved ones. He showed us how to fold the prayer and tuck it humbly and carefully beneath the saint's reliquary for safekeeping. The reliquary contains the Saint's incorrupt face and body. ~Continued on next page

Our pilgrimage included a visit to the bookstore, where we expressed our gratitude through the purchase of icons, books and other spiritual objects. Afterwards, Father Gabriel and Presvytera Iulia drove to the East Bay to attend a matinee concert performed by the Romania Acapella Quintet, Anatoly.*

The rest of us drove to the famous Cinderella Bakery & Café.* We hung out on its patio for two hours, enjoying dinner and fellowship with Father Pete until it was time to go to our second destination: a live Christmas concert performed by Capella Romana,* hosted by Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church.* Father Gabriel and Presvytera Iulia re-joined us there. The concert was amazing and inspirational -- the voices of the choir lifted our hearts to God. Their lofty mission "to experience and understand the transcendent beauty of the sacred music of the Christian East and West, especially of Byzantium, by cultivating this rich cultural heritage and sharing it worldwide" became clear to us.

We returned home fulfilled as Orthodox Christians in fellowship with Christ, the Theotokos, the saints, our beloved clergy, and one another.

Stewardship

WHAT IS STEWARDSHIP? WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Stewardship supports the Orthodox Christian practice of consistent, cheerful and purposeful giving of time, talent and treasure in support of our Church and its ministries to help further the word and teachings of Jesus Christ. On a personal level, it supports and showcases a life being lived in Christ. Stewardship creates and fosters a spirit of generosity and giving for the Glory of God. When we are generous and give freely of our time, talent, and treasure we proclaim, preserve, and practice our Orthodox Christian faith and make a difference in our parish and community. Stewardship furthers Christ's message within ourselves, our families, and our communities. This creates a spiritual atmosphere of worship, engagement, fulfillment, and inspiration that we can offer to the world, following the example set by God Himself of love, service, and giving.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A STEWARD?

Stewardship is a personal responsibility and prayerful commitment that each and every Christian makes in order to support the Church. Stewardship helps us understand that God is the true owner of our possessions, and each of us is accountable to God for the acceptable care and use of those possessions. According to the Bible, a steward is one who responsibly manages the gifts entrusted to them for the perpetuation of the Lord's work. A steward honors and glorifies God.

WHAT ARE THE ELEMENTS OF STEWARDSHIP?

Orthodox Christian stewardship has these key elements:

- Leitourgia (Worship) Literally means "Work of the people" (also where the word "liturgy" comes from). It is the active participation of the people in the Work of God
- Koinonia (Fellowship) Gathering together and giving glory to God as a Parish Family
- Diakonia (Service) Offering our best to Christ by helping those around us
- Martyria (Bearing Witness) Living a life in Christ and being an example for others

HOW DOES STEWARDSHIP HELP THE CHURCH?

Money is a necessary tool for ministry. Every act of giving, no matter the size, makes a difference. Generosity is contagious. The Church's mission of salvation and evangelism depends directly on our generosity. Our Parish's many ministries, including Sunday Church School, Music Ministry, VIP Ministry, GOYA, HOPE, JOY and Choir Ministry, are all funded by our stewardship. Stewardship is vital to our Church and, among many things, helps to:

- Provide religious services and sacraments
- Provide religious counseling
- Provides visitations to the hospitalized and shut-ins
- Minister to the community outside of our Church walls
- Offer help and support to those in need
- Support those who serve us
- Support our Metropolis
- Keep our Church grounds and buildings in good condition

WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT STEWARDSHIP? GIVING TO GLORIFY GOD

"We thank you, our God, and praise your glorious Name ... for all things come from you and we have only given back what is yours already." (I Chronicles 29:13-14)

GIVING WHOLEHEARTEDLY

"And He (Jesus) looked up and saw the rich putting their gifts into the treasury, and He saw also a certain poor widow putting in two mites. So, He said, "Truly I say to you that this poor widow has put in more than all; for all these out of their abundance have put in offerings for God, but she out of her poverty put in all the livelihood that she had." (Luke 21:1-4)

GIVING CHEERFULLY

"Let everyone give as his heart tells him, neither grudgingly, nor under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. (II Corinthians 9:7)

GIVING FREELY

"He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully."(II Corinthians 9:6)

"Let not your left hand know what your right hand is doing." (Matthew 6:3)
