## *The Joy of Giving our Best Gift!*

### Living Our Faith as We Prepare for Great Lent

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Here in February, deep in the Triodion, we stand on the threshold of Great Lent, beginning Clean Monday, February 23. This sacred time calls us to examine our lives honestly and to embrace stewardship—not as an obligation, but as the natural outflow of gratitude for all God has given.

Our Archdiocese teaches that Orthodox stewardship is truly “a way of life,” one that acknowledges our accountability, reverence, and responsibility before God. Every blessing—our time, talents, treasures, and the very world around us—belongs to Him first. We are invited to return them with open hands, using them to draw nearer to Christ and to serve those He loves. St. Basil the Great, our patron, lived this truth boldly. He built the Basiliad to care for the sick, orphans, and poor, declaring plainly: “The bread you hold back belongs to the hungry; the coat you guard in your wardrobe belongs to the naked.” He saw withholding from the needy not as mere selfishness, but as a form of theft from those God entrusts to our care. His words challenge us: Are we truly following Christ if we hoard what was never ours alone?

Great Lent sharpens this call through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—the very heartbeat of stewardship. In these disciplines, we learn detachment, humility, and generous love. In every Divine Liturgy it is proclaimed: “Thine own of Thine own we offer unto Thee, in behalf of all and for all.” We don’t earn God’s love; we respond to it by giving back what is already His. In that humble offering, our hearts soften, love grows, the Church is strengthened, and we ready ourselves for the Paschal joy. St. Basil, St. John Chrysostom, and our cloud of witnesses urges us onward. Let us not delay.

**Please, prayerfully complete your 2026 Pledge Card**—now simpler with digital options. Approach it with a generous heart while trusting God to multiply what we return to Him. This act of faith becomes part of our Lenten journey toward resurrection life.

May St. Basil intercede for us as we walk this path together.

\*New members: membership is free for the first year.


