The Joy of Giving our Best Gift!



As we enter the sacred season of **Great Lent**, we are invited to embrace this time of spiritual renewal with the authentic phronema—the mind of Christ—that defines our Orthodox faith. In the Orthodox understanding, stewardship is not merely a financial obligation but a profound expression of gratitude, trust, and love toward God, who is the source of all blessings. As stewards, we recognize that everything we have—time, talents, and treasure—belongs to Him, and we return a portion cheerfully and proportionately, offering back "Your own of Your own we offer to You, in all and for all" in thanksgiving (from the Divine Liturgy).

This Lenten journey of fasting, prayer, repentance, and almsgiving aligns beautifully with our call to stewardship. Great Lent strips away excess, refocuses our hearts on Christ, and cultivates generosity towards God and neighbor. It is a season to deepen our phronema, living as true caretakers of the gifts entrusted to us.

With joy, we congratulate our beloved parish for a remarkable achievement in 2025! For the first time in many years, we surpassed our annual Stewardship goal of \$335,000, receiving \$337,468.05 in contributions. This success reflects the faithful commitment of our stewards and is a testament to the vibrant life of our parish. Well done, good and faithful servants!

Building on this momentum, the Stewardship Team invites everyone to **Stewardship Sunday on March 15th** and to embrace our theme: **"The Joy of Giving Our Best Gift."** True joy arises not from holding back but from offering our best—sacrificially and gratefully—to support the ministries, worship, outreach, and fellowship that sustain our parish life. We're excited to grow Stewardship even more and we plan to share our 2026 vision at Stewardship Sunday and throughout the year in various ways because Stewardship is essential for our spiritual well-being and relationship with God. Our Lord Himself says: "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also". (Matthew 6:21).

Please take a moment during this holy season to complete a pledge card whether online or with the paper form available in the parish office. We also ask that you prayerfully consider the giving guidelines in determining your best gift. If you already filled your pledge card yet feel compelled to increase it after reading the giving guidelines below, you are more than welcome to do so. Whatever your amount, we are most grateful, and pray it is a meaningful step in our shared journey toward Pascha and beyond. May the prayers and ascetic efforts of Great Lent fill us with the joy of generous hearts, as we offer our best gifts to the Lord who gave everything for us.

2026 St. Basil Giving Guidelines

1) Moving towards the Tithe

The concept of tithing (giving 10% of one's income) is found in various places in Scripture (ie: Genesis 14:20; Numbers 18:21; Malachi 3:7-10; Matthew 23:23).

In accordance with the ancient biblical principle of the tithe, "Stewardship is recommended to be ten percent (10%) of one's annual income as stated in Holy Scripture to help meet the financial obligations of the Parish, the Metropolis and the Archdiocese." (2025 Greek Orthodox Archdiocese Regulations, Part 3, Article 18, Section 1, pg. 31).

While tithing is the biblical ideal, some of us may not be at a place where we feel we can give 10% of our income. In light of all this, our goal is to have parishioners move towards the tithe. If you gave 1% of your income last year, give 2% ; if you gave 2% go to 3% and so forth. Ultimately, there is no minimum or maximum Stewardship commitment, and we are grateful for any amount you are able to do and that makes you feel good inside your heart!

2) What do we treasure?

Our Lord taught, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21). In *Money & Salvation: An Invitation to the Good Way*, Andrew Geleris says, "The four Gospels record Jesus talking far more about finances than any other single topic except the kingdom of God." Why? What the Lord is trying to teach us is that stewardship is essential for a healthy relationship with God and our spiritual health.

In light of this, what do we treasure? What we treasure can be determined by our personal budget—could someone see how important God is to us based on our home budget? We are called in the Scriptures to give our fruits-fruits, our very best to God. We are called to imitate Abel who gave his very best to God, in contrast to his brother Cain who did not (Genesis 4:3-5). In other words, we want to avoid the mindset of giving whatever is left over at the end of the year. If God is our priority, we're called to show that through our Stewardship.

Another way to determine if our gift is our best is if it compares to or exceeds contributions we make to hobbies, memberships, sport tickets, tv and streaming services, etc. (Matthew 6:21).

3) Give joyfully

The other essential aspect of determining our stewardship is that the amount we offer is one we can do joyfully, "not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor. 9:7).

4) Frequency of giving

Giving frequently (weekly or monthly) is preferred for a few reasons: 1) it's easier to give regularly rather than infrequently at larger amounts, or even one large sum at the end of the year; 2) it greatly helps the Church with its monthly expenses; and 3) if we end up blessed financially more than what we had anticipated, we can always adjust our gift.

It's also important to keep in mind that our pledged amount can be adjusted if we have an unanticipated hardship. Again, the Church is not here to bring us harm, but rather to help us prioritize God in our life.

Weekly or monthly auto-pay option - using one of the methods available to us here at St. Basil parish is encouraged to help keep things simple, and it helps the parish with cash flow and planning.
