UPDATE ON FR. GABRIEL REASSIGNMENT

Dear Faithful and Friends of St. Basil,

As was communicated last month, the donation which supports the second Priest position will only last through this December, rather than the Fall of 2027 as we had initially planned. The Parish Council informed His Eminence Metropolitan Gerasimos of this unexpected development and it is our belief that **Fr. Gabriel will be reassigned to another parish in our Metropolis this fall - most likely October 1.**

At the time of printing for this issue of the Basilian, we have not yet received official communication of this reassignment. Once we do, we will communicate this information to everyone.

While we are all saddened to lose Fr. Gabriel, Pres. Iulia and David Gabriel—and they are equally saddened to be leaving us - we should be comforted by the fact that the parish they anticipate moving to will be a very good situation for them both personally and for Fr. Gabriel's own vocational growth.

We can also take pride in the fact that we provided Fr. Gabriel and his family their very first parish assignment, one where Fr. Gabriel became a Deacon then Priest, and where he grew in his pastoral ministry. We also provided them the opportunity to begin their process of achieving permanent status in this country, and one which we will be praying reaches its fulfillment.

More will be said when we honor the Cupsa family on **Sunday, September 27** after the Divine Liturgy (see the flyer in this issue on the first page for further details). Please be sure to make reservations, as I anticipate the luncheon to be very well attended, and without reservations, your seat will not be secured.

May our Lord continue to watch over Fr. Gabriel, Pres. Iulia and David Gabriel, and may He bless them always!

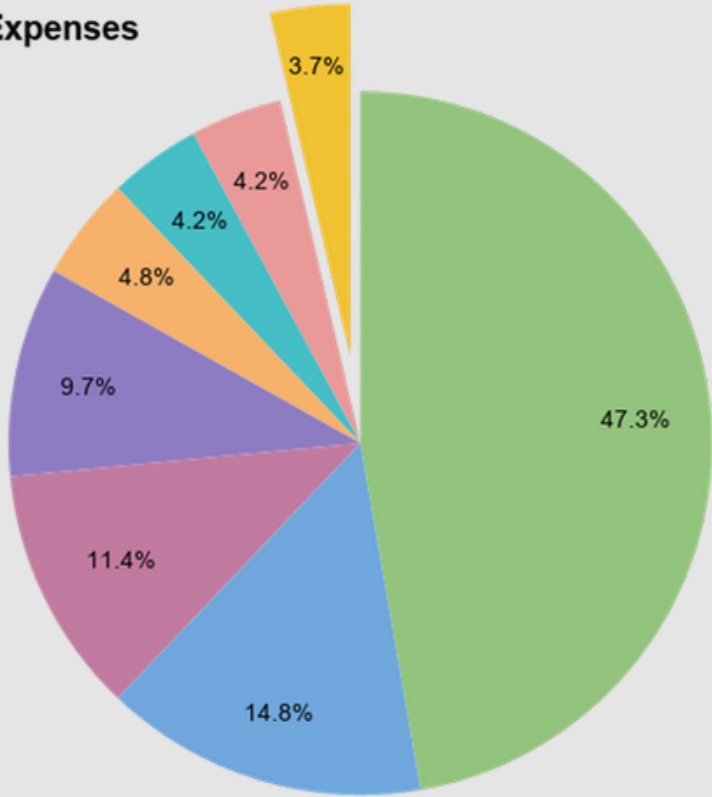

When he returns, he asks each servant to account for what was done with that gift. To those who used and multiplied what they had received, he says, "Well done, good and faithful servant."

At the conclusion of the parable, Jesus teaches, "From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and from the one to whom much has been entrusted, even more will be demanded (Luke 12:48)."

We should not be afraid, nor should we force ourselves into responsibilities for which we are unprepared. God has blessed each of us with particular gifts and abilities. He will place people and opportunities in our path, and if we remain open to Him, He can use us in ways we may never have imagined to strengthen and share our faith.

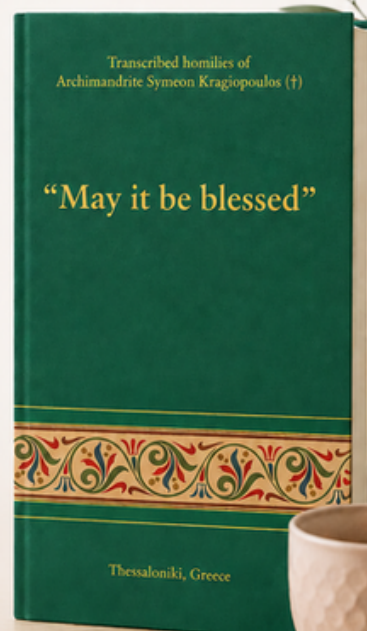

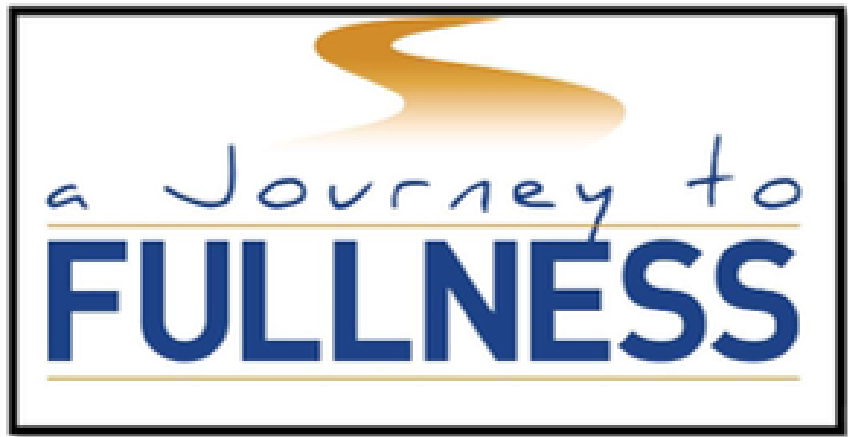

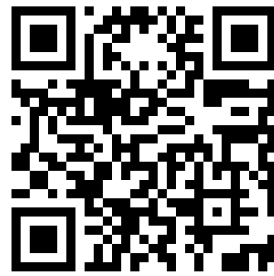


Sunday School at St Basil's will start Sunday, September 27. Please be sure to register your child with Veronica Falcinella or on the church website/scanning the QR Code.

The Reverend Father Constantine Efstathiou

60th Anniversary of His Ordination to the Holy Priesthood

Today is truly a blessed and historic day as we not only gather to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Apodosis of the Dormition of the Theotokos, but also to commemorate 60 years of faithful service to the Holy Priesthood of **Fr. Constantine Efstathiou**. St. John Chrysostom, in speaking of the sacred calling of the priesthood, reminds us of the extraordinary dignity and responsibility entrusted to the priest. He writes that the priesthood is exercised here on earth, but that it belongs to the heavenly order. The priest stands before God and becomes an instrument of His grace, to give his life for the spiritual care and salvation of God's people. Sixty years ago, a young Constantine Efstathiou answered that calling.

On Sunday, August 28, 1966, Father Constantine was ordained to the Holy Priesthood at St. Anthony's in Pasadena, California. His priestly journey began with his first assignment at Holy Trinity in San Francisco, under the tutelage and guidance of the late Father Anthony Costuros. He then went on to serve the faithful of St. Basil's in Stockton. And then, by God's Divine providence, he was assigned to Nativity of Christ. Sixty years is more than a milestone Fr. Constantine. It is six decades of offering yourself to Christ by standing before the holy altar, baptizing, marrying, burying, teaching, comforting, encouraging, praying, and walking alongside generations of the faithful.

For sixty years, families have known you as their priest. Children who came to you as young altar boys and Sunday School students have now grown to be priests, Sunday School teachers, Parish Council members, parents, and grandparents.

You have celebrated with them in moments of joy and prayed with them in moments of sorrow. have celebrated with them in moments of joy and prayed with them in moments of sorrow.

The faithful of Nativity of Christ give glory to God for granting you the health and strength to continue your service, but we also thank you, Fr. Constantine, for the example of love and humility you have displayed particularly to this Parish these last 42 years.

We thank you for the prayers that no one has seen, the acts of kindness that may never have been acknowledged, and the countless lives that have been touched by your priestly ministry. Through your prayerful, humble, and joyful example, you continue to inspire us all to know in our hearts that God is real and that He loves us.

The ministry of a priest however is never simply the ministry of one person. It is a life that touches an entire family. Throughout your priesthood, you have also been blessed with the support, and encouragement of your beloved wife, Presvytera Kandiana, who answered that call alongside you 60 years ago, and shared in the sacrifices, challenges, and blessings of a life dedicated to the Church.

We recognize and honor the memory of Presvytera and fondly remember her faithful love, support, and companionship throughout your life together.

We are also grateful to your children and grandchildren who just so happen to be here today to celebrate this occasion with you.... What a tremendous blessing it is that just yesterday, you were given the joy of marrying your granddaughter, and just the day before yesterday, the blessing of baptizing your great-grandson.

What a beautiful testimony to a life of priestly service: to have witnessed generations of your family grow in the faith and worship Christ during the most special moments of their lives through the sacred sacraments of the Church. Your family's love, support, and sacrifice have been part of your priestly ministry in ways that only you truly know. May God continue to bless you Fr. Constantine with health, steadfast faith, and, most importantly, the knowledge that your life and your service have touched countless people and continue to bear fruit for generations who give all glory and praise to our Lord Jesus Christ.
